Veterinarian Says Dog Lucky To Survive

STAFFORD SPRINGS, Conn. -- A Stafford Springs family said their dog was shot with a bow and arrow.

Audrey Owens said her dog, Harley, got out of the house through a window. She said he was found on the front lawn.

"There was blood all over the front walkway ... and throughout the house," said Jason Hagenow, who found Harley .

The veterinarian who treated the dog said he believes he was shot with a bow and arrow and that the dog is lucky to have survived.

Four-year-old Harley lost a lot of blood, but according to the veterinarian, is expected to survive.

Police said they are investigating the incident.
